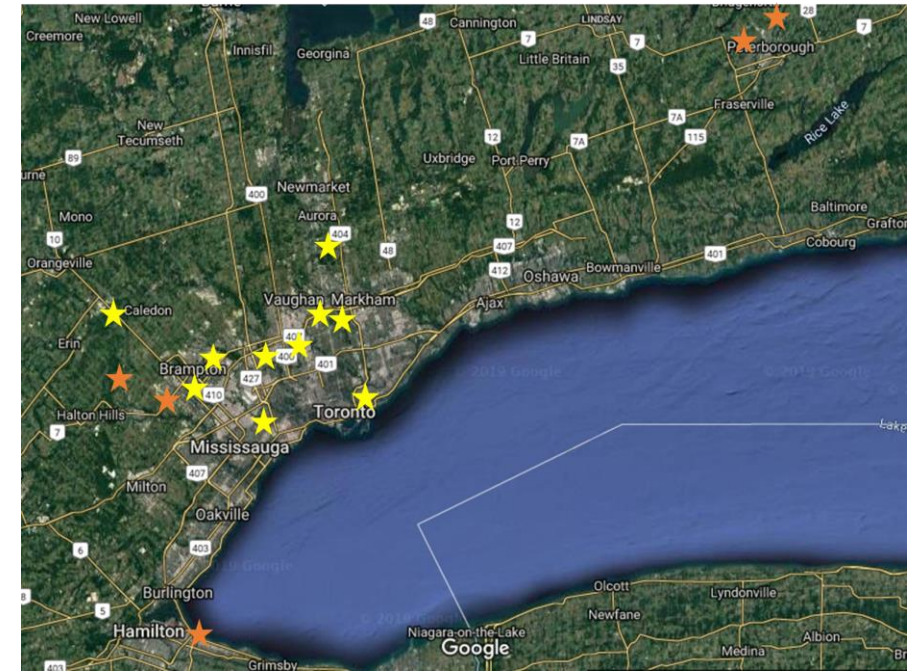
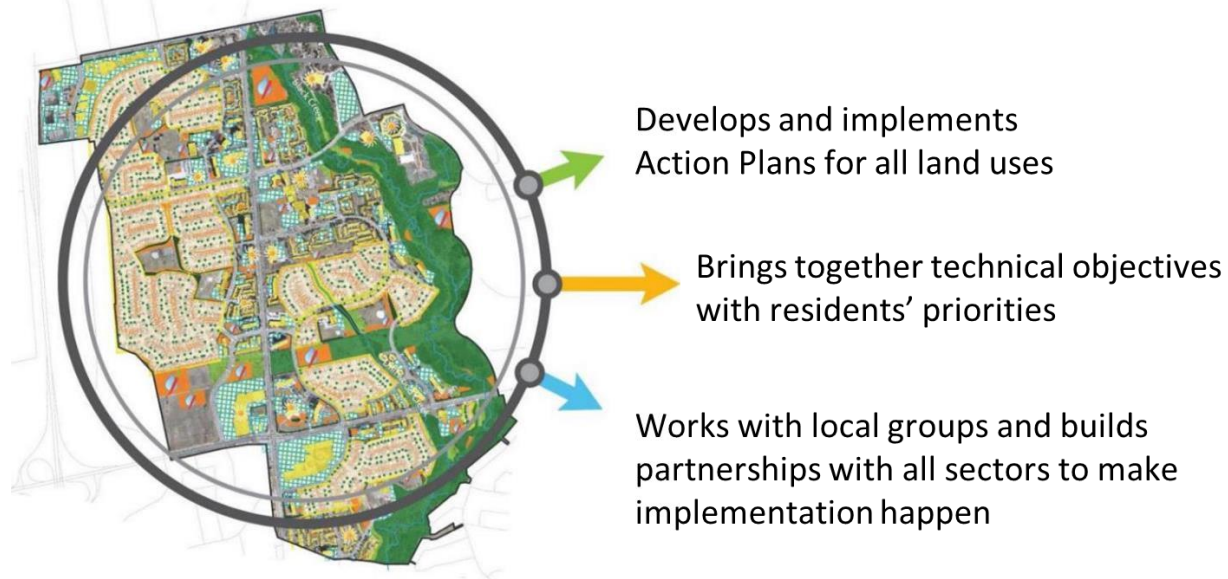

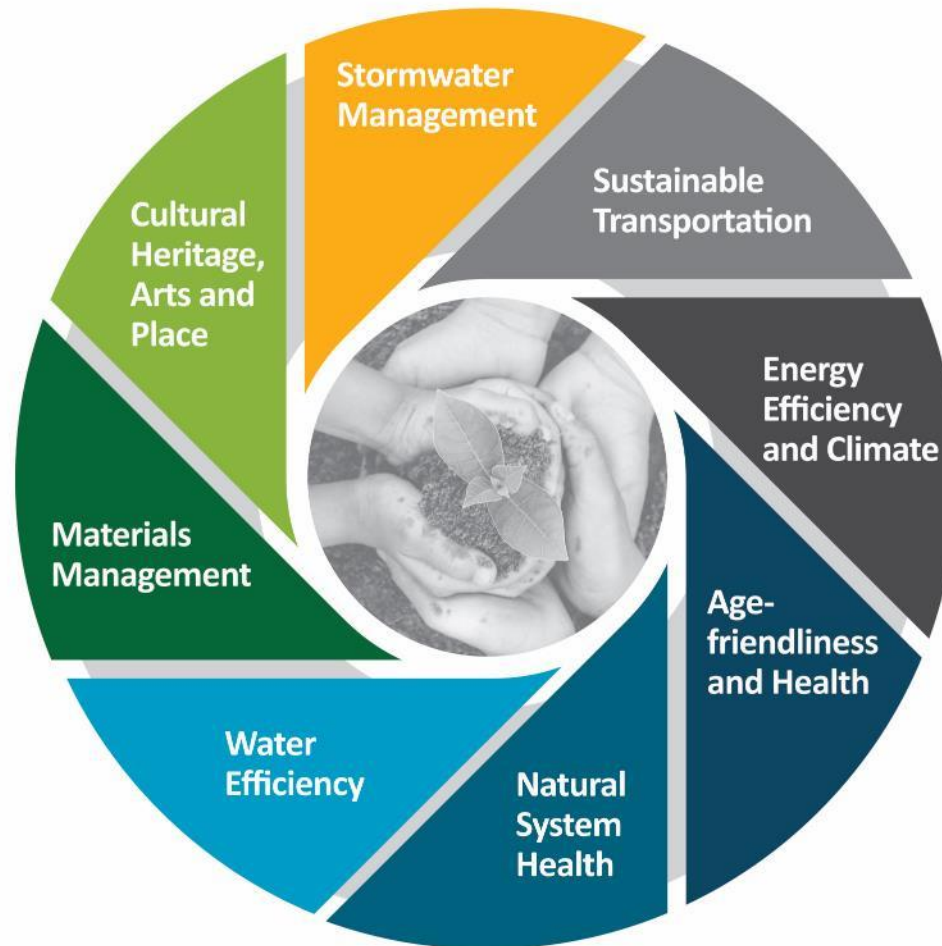

- Help strengthen community connections by providing opportunities for residents to come together.

2 - Green Home Program

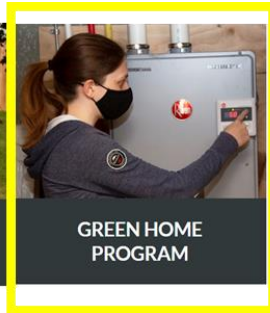
- Objective: To promote uptake of home retrofits which will have the most impact in addressing key neighbourhood environmental challenges.

Example: Heritage Hills Parkette Revitalization

- Playground replacement
- De-paving of wide pathway and installation of pollinator gardens
- Tree planting
